


At PIM, we pursue our vision through our network of ministry teams, and by seeking to mobilise the wider church to proclaim Christ across our nation.

Nomads Network - A community of people in a similar life stage, providing inspiration, training, community and useful opportunities to serve.

Training Workshops - Practical teaching that aims to help elders and church members in rural communities to better serve in their local churches.
