At Presbyterian Inland Mission (PIM), our vision is to see people living in the remote and sparsely populated areas of Australia become mature and faithful followers of Jesus.

As a ministry of the Presbyterian Church of Australia, we've been taking the good news of Jesus to the furthest regions of our country since our foundation in 1912, by the Rev John Flynn.

We continue that mission today through our network of ministry teams, and from our new long-term home in Ardlethan NSW, New Dunesk.

By the grace of God and the support of donors and local churches, we seek to fulfil Christ's command to *"go and make disciples of all nations, baptising them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, and teaching them to obey everything I have commanded you"* (Matthew 28:19-20).

At PIM, we pursue our vision through our network of ministry teams, and by seeking to mobilise the wider church to proclaim Christ across our nation.

Our ministry teams live and work in remote areas of Australia, building long-term relationships with different people and communities. These teams create opportunities to proclaim Christ to people who have never really heard the Gospel. They also intentionally disciple isolated Christians and pastorally care for people in a variety of different circumstances.

In many of the places where PIM's ministry teams work, there is little or no other Gospel witness. This work involves extensive remote area travel and a long-term commitment to local communities.

Our pursuit to mobilise the wider church is done primarily through events and activities at New Dunesk, our 600 acre farm in the NSW Riverina.







New Dunesk is PIM's bold new initiative to inspire, equip and send out God's people for ministry to Inland Australia.

Set in the Riverina of New South Wales, this unique property is not only the new physical home for PIM, but also a place for the whole church.

It's a place where Jillaroos and Jackeroos can network, Grey Nomads are trained and resourced, and Gap Year students gain a heart for the bush. It's a place that will see churches bush camping together, and travellers being drawn in for rest.

New Dunesk has a place for everyone.

Consider getting involved in one of the many events and programs, including:

New Dunesk Gap Year - A program for 18-20 year olds to develop practical farm and ministry skills at New Dunesk and in the surrounding community.

Nomads' Network - A community of people in a similar life stage, providing inspiration, training, community and useful opportunities to serve.

Country Elders Preaching Workshop - A practical workshop to help elders in rural communities step up in their local churches. This is a joint programme with Langham Partnership.

Camper Trailer Muster - A family-oriented long weekend where adults and kids can enjoy the surrounds of New Dunesk and be inspired by what God is doing around our country.

More exciting program are regularly being developed at New Dunesk.
