#### The plan from Snowy River

Sometimes it takes a long time for a dream to become a reality. For at least fifteen years, we have longed to bring the Gospel of the Lord Jesus to the remote and isolated communities in the rugged mountains along the Victorian-NSW border.

Throughout this time, local churches and presbyteries familiar with the area have greatly desired to see ministry expand out into those isolated places. PIM have been approached many times to see how we could help, and though many ideas and plans have been discussed over the years, a lack of available resources have made it difficult to make a start.

It is a sad reality that in many isolated areas of our continent there are long term residents who live out their lives without genuinely encountering the Gospel of the Lord Jesus. The distances in the Snowy Mountains are much shorter than PIM teams face in the outback, but the isolation and lack of sound Gospel witness is just as real.

In God's wonderful timing, an opportunity to start a Snowy Mountains Patrol has now arrived. During 2021, a local man with a big heart for the area and a love for the Lord stepped forward and provided a large financial donation that now allows us to get started on this long held dream. The new work we are planning to begin in the Snowy Mountains area will see Christ proclaimed in places where at present there is no credible Gospel witness. By God's grace, local disciples will be raised up to become mature followers of the Lord Jesus Christ. In time, we pray that small local churches will be planted in places where there are currently none.

Like all the things we do at PIM, this new work will involve contributions from lots of people. Early in 2022, we will begin the recruitment process to find the right people to start this work. We will also be asking for prayer partners to join us in this exciting new ministry, and will be looking for additional financial supporters to help make these plans sustainable into the future. There will also likely be opportunities for volunteers to help out with various projects as we prepare to get started.

Long into the night the harvesters work, bringing in the crops from the paddocks around New Dunesk and right across the Riverina. In the Yarra Valley where I live, teams of workers will hand pick fruit over the summer months ahead.

In different places and at different times across Australia, crops are harvested as they begin their journey from the paddock to the plate.



All of this produce only grows because people have put in the hard work long before there was a green shoot in a paddock or a flower on a fruit tree. The pruning and ploughing, fertilising and sowing was all done so that one a day a crop would be yielded.

In recent years at PIM we have taken some time to focus on pruning, fertilising and tending to the PIM 'tree' so that it will yield fruit in the future.
